Dear Toi Shaver:

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) acknowledges receipt of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission's report on an alleged unauthorized disposition of a former Enforcement supervisor's files.

According to the report, the EEOC Agency Records Officer (ARO) reviewed the files of the former supervisor and found no evidence that shows an unauthorized disposition of records occurred. From a subsequent telephone conversation, we understand that the ARO could not find any records matching the description and date range of the records alleged to have been destroyed. The records were also the subject of a FOIA in which no responsive records were found. NARA acknowledges that if such records did exist, the ARO believes they would have been appropriately disposed of in accordance with GRS 2.2, Employee Management Files, Item 080, Supervisors' Personnel Files.

Based on this information, the reporting requirements of 36 CFR 1230.14(a) have been met and NARA considers this matter closed. I appreciate your attention to this matter.
